The Mission Statement of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena

Dear Friends,

To say that 2020 was a year of change and disruption, adaptation and invention is a tremendous understatement. We began with spirits high, a wonderful celebration of my installation as your pastor, big crowds for Brown Bag and Bible, and plans for mission outreach and growth. Then, in March, in the space of a few days, the world changed. The coronavirus was declared a world-wide pandemic and every facet of our lives – and the lives of people around the world – changed. Ministry continued, albeit in ways we never could have imagined one year ago. In less than thirty-six hours - from the time session decided to suspend in-person worship to our first on-line virtual service - I pivoted from how I'd led worship for over thirty years to relying on technology that was new to me and to most of us.

First Presbyterian was prescient when, a few years back, t-shirts were printed that proclaimed, "The Church has left the Building." Indeed, the church is not the building, no matter how much we enjoy and appreciate the fine structure on Preston Road that we call home. Though unable to gather in person as we'd like, we have continued to be the church – to worship God, study the scriptures, care for one another, and work with our mission partners. We had two successful food drives for Pasadena Community Ministries, continued our outreach to the residents and staff of Baywood Crossing and Pasadena Interfaith Manor, filled over one hundred boxes for international seafarers, contributed to the efforts of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to aid those whose lives were disrupted by tropical storms, built a water well in a third world nation, and sent countless cards and notes to members and others.

I have led more than thirty virtual worship services, more than fifty virtual devotionals, three parking lot services, numerous Bible studies, Session and Deacons' meetings, Ministry meetings, book group discussions, Presbyterian Women lessons, officer training sessions, Wonderful Wednesday discussions, virtual coffee hours, and even on-line luncheons! I've spent hundreds of hours on phone calls, sent thousands of texts and emails, attended three on-line stated meetings of Presbytery, recorded prayers for medical staff at Memorial Southeast Hospital, and attended weekly on-line meetings with area faith leaders, hospital administrators, county health and emergency management authorities, business leaders, and public school personnel.

We started 2020 with an in-person study of Ephesians and concluded the year with an in-depth, on-line study of Philippians, which will be completed during the first quarter of 2021. Gathering weekly – even by Zoom – has been a highlight of the year. We have proven that it is possible – and fun! – to study the scriptures together even when we are all on a computer instead of in the same room!

The most difficult part of the last nine months has been not being able to be together physically as we always have taken for granted. Ordinarily, a large proportion of my time would be spent making hospital visits and visits to home-bound members and those who live in communal settings. To safeguard the health of patients, staff, and residents, pastoral visits have not been allowed. I am so glad I was able to meet so many of our members before March, and I'm grateful that technology has allowed me to stay in touch. I yearn for the time when casual visits are again possible.

2020 has been unlike anything I ever could have imagined, but God has been with us throughout. We have worshiped God, who transcends all barriers of space and time, and leaned on God to keep us close in spirit, even while physically apart. I pray for us all to stay well and trust in God. In God's time, we once again will love and support one another in more traditional ways. In the meantime, let us be patient, constant in prayer, and diligent in actions that love and serve the Lord by watching out for one another.

We are always grateful for the support and loving guidance from our Parish Associate, Pat Abrams, who kept us on track and answered any questions regarding policy or procedures in the art of being “shepherds” to our “flocks”.

## Report of the Clerk of Session

This past year has been a year unlike any other for members of session. We started the year meeting as usual in person. The January meeting saw the election of Marvin Clark as Treasurer, Cynthia Berridge as Trustee from the Class of 2022, Roy Kreitz and Margaret Bardin to serve on the Personnel Committee as elders and the date for the Annual Congregational meeting was set. The February session meeting saw two elders elected to serve as representatives to the March Presbytery meeting. The March session meeting was the first stated session meeting held via Zoom. Elder Bardin and Rev. Fair gave a report on events from the March Presbytery meeting at the April session meeting

At the October stated session meeting, three elders were elected to represent First Presbyterian Church at the November Presbytery meeting via Zoom. November was another busy session meeting with the 2020 Communion schedule being approved and thanks to the elders rolling off of session at the end of the year.

I would like to thank Barbara Davis for reviewing the minutes prior to each session meeting. Thanks go to all the ministry and committee chairs and members for serving this church this past year.


As we find new ways to grow in our faith and service, the Discipleship Ministry continues to pray for guidance as we plan activities and opportunities to help each member to grow in theirs.


- ◆ Completed weekly updates on the church website with the assistance of church staff
- ◆ Hosted Pasadena Community Ministries volunteer luncheon on January 20
- ◆ Helped advertise and attended Brotherhood Banquet, sponsored by FPCP, Knights of Columbus, and B'nai B'rith on February 24 at Fontainebleau Event Center
- ◆ Organized congregational effort through Presbyterian Giving Catalog/Links of Love campaign to raise the money to pay for a water well
- ◆ Worked with area churches and the Pasadena Chamber of Commerce to provide food and funds for Pasadena Community Ministries and local food banks at the beginning of the pandemic
- ◆ Presented weekly worship services and weekly Spanish Bible studies at Baywood Crossing Rehabilitation and Healthcare Center from January to March
- ◆ Organized a campaign to write letters of encouragement and provide puzzle books for residents and staff of Baywood Crossing
- ◆ Helped Dr. Fair reinstitute Wonderful Wednesdays in the fall via Zoom, featuring Rev. Cathy Chang and Juan Lopez, Presbyterian Mission Partners serving in the Philippines; Rev. David Wells, chaplain in the Port of Houston; and Rev. Tomas Spath and Rev. Cassandra Dahnke from the Institute for Civility in Government
- ◆ Sponsored Gloria Ramirez Pena, who made \$580 selling tamales for her benefit
- ◆ Held a Day of Service on November 14, where members donated: 68 seafarers' Christmas boxes (in addition to the 40 Presbyterian Women contributed), toiletries for seafarers who are not allowed off of ships, five hygiene kits for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance/Church World Services, food and money to Pasadena Community Ministries, and letters and cards of encouragement and puzzle books for residents of Pasadena Interfaith Manor
- ◆ Supported missionary Janet Sue Whetzel through the church budget
- ◆ Provided 3 board members to Pasadena Interfaith Manor
- ◆ Designated the Peace and Global Witness Offering to go to Pasadena Community Ministries and the Pentecost Offering to go to Covenant House
- ◆ Sponsored Bethlehem Market, which provided opportunities to give to various missions

## Personnel Ministry

The Personnel Ministry, chaired by Roy Krietz and co-chaired by Margaret Bardin, worked with staff to address opportunities and confidential issues.

At the beginning of the pandemic, elders applied for a Paycheck Protection Program (*PPP*) loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), which enabled the church to meet payroll without impacting church budget. The Paycheck Protection Program is a loan designed to provide a direct incentive for small businesses to keep their workers on the payroll. SBA will forgive loans if all employee retention criteria are met, and the funds are used for eligible expenses.

## Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Committee offers the following highlights and major accomplishments for 2020. The committee consists of Session Members Brett Coe (Chairman), Roy Kreitz, along with congregational members, Danny Slaven, Marvin Clark, Bruce Walters, Milo Wharry, and Stan Ganderson (Secretary).

The ongoing, strategic work of the Stewardship Committee revolves around the efforts of maintaining budget guidelines, monthly reporting of financials, facilities operation, and safety and maintenance of the church campus. Particular attention is given to building maintenance and lawn care to facilitate visitor's first impressions of First Presbyterian. Other key highlights for 2020 are:

- ♦ **2021 Budget** – Prepared the initial 2021, first draft of the asking budget for Session review; will coordinate the final budget for Session approval and presentation to the congregation in early 2021.
- ♦ **SBA Loan** – Federal loan applied for and received \$46,254. This was for the PPP (Payroll Protection Program) under the CARES Act. Loan does not have to be repaid.
- ♦ **HVAC** - Several key areas addressed throughout the year including compressor replacements, fan motor repairs, thermostat wiring replaced on all units, all filters on air handlers replaced. Many of these issues were due to power surges. Power surges were researched by Center Point and solved with wiring and switch replacement on their end. *Many thanks to the knowledge and skills of Bruce Walters, Roy Kreitz, and Brett Coe helping keep maintenance costs down and working close with service providers.*
- ♦ **Mailbox** – Installed and painted a new security wall mounted mailbox. This was due to thefts of church mail.
- ♦ **LED Lighting** – Numerous incandescent and fluorescent light fixtures updated and replaced with LED option in various office, hallways, parking lot, and sanctuary locations.
- ♦ **Plumbing & Ceiling** – Numerous restroom repairs completed throughout the year. Also, several ceiling leaks were repaired along with numerous ceiling tiles being replaced. Repaired main water line coming into church by replacing gasket, elbow and flange fittings.
- ♦ **Information Technology (I.T.)** – Continued support provided for software and hardware requirements. The email service provider was changed and converted after diligent research to Google G-Suites. Network cables and cameras installed for streaming services during pandemic.
- ♦ **Covid Protocols** – Sanctuary modification performed, assisted with entrance guidelines and screening of congregation. Constructed cover for pastor and stand for organist for outdoor services.
- ♦ **Painting** – Maria has been painting various interior sections of the church during the building closure to the general congregation.
- ♦ **Preschool Sign** – A new exterior sign produced and installed on Preston Avenue. Special thanks to Marilyn Wilkins for the printing and to Mark Corder, Danny Slaven, and David Kirkpatrick for installing.
- ♦ **Electronic Outdoor Sign** – Several malfunction incidents troubleshot and handled over the phone. Many thanks to Barbara Davis.
- ♦ **2021 Pledge Campaign** – Coordinated the 2021 campaign of letters to the congregation, Minutes for Mission on Stewardship and mailing of the 2021 pledge cards.
- ♦ **Lawn Care** – Ongoing mowing and yard services, along with limb trimming throughout the year. Special thanks to all the Mowing Team and Bruce Walters for his tree trimming work.


Against the backdrop of difficult times, there were still accomplishments:

  - o Joy Gift – December 24th.


